Servants after the heart of Jesus

On 24 April 2016 we commenced the Silver Jubilee Year of the birth of our Province. The wonder of Salesian life, which began its tale at Becchi, still continues to be resplendent in the various works and interventions in our Province. As we look back with gratitude and look forward with hope, let the passion of Don Bosco for young people guide our present. We need to be grateful to God for the expansion and development that we have achieved in the past with 32 communities with 63 activities, collapsing the borders of the Telugu states to venture into Odisha significantly after the aftermath of the Kandhamal violence.

This occasion offers us an opportune moment to reflect seriously about our interventions. *Our solidarity with the people, especially the poor and marginalized has to be a true reflection of the diakonia that we have freely chosen to live.* We need to introspect and remind ourselves that *our mission* is not merely to provide service to the poor and needy. It is not even an intellectual doctrine or a moral code, it is *a real and living self communication of God.* “...just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many” (Mt. 20:28). We have to make a constant pastoral conversion and a paradigm shift, as a province and as individuals, *from being mere service providers or care takers to being servants of the young.*

People around us and those who work with us, generally admire the amount of work we do. We are living witnesses of a workaholic culture rampant in our society. Overwhelmed by the activities and the workaholic culture, sometimes we get worn out, tired and experience a sense of burnout. This happens because, more often than not, we are concerned about the success of our works rather than the meaningfulness and relevance of our mission. We allow the worldly orientation of success and accomplishment to be the parameters for gauging the relevance of our works. Most often we are far more concerned about maintaining and preserving our established structures than the integral wellbeing of the young through intellectual, social and spiritual accompaniment of the young.

Being a servant of the young is an attitude of the heart. Jesus invites, “learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart” (Mt. 11:29). In all humility we have to consciously enter into the world of the young through personal touch and accompaniment, seeking their utmost welfare as Don Bosco did. This can happen only at the level of the heart. What comes from the heart lands on the heart. In our desire to renew and rejuvenate our life and mission at the start of this academic year 2016-17, let us march on with this attitude.

One of the simple indicators of this attitude of being a servant is the number of young people we encounter during the day and the amount of time we spend physically and meaningfully amidst them. Don Bosco while away from Turin, writes in his famous letter from Rome: *“Being away from you and not being able to see or hear you, upsets me more than you can imagine.”* Another yardstick to measure the meaningfulness and fruitfulness of our mission is the number of young people who keep in touch with us even after leaving our institution. Even when they do come back, is it merely for some monetary benefits or earnestly seeking guidance and accompaniment? Let us seek the intercession of Mary Help of Christians and learn from the Sacred Heart of Jesus, gentle, meek and mild, to whom this month is dedicated, to cultivate and nurture the attitude of a servant.

Vision Building - Perpetually Professed Confreres’ Meet and Leaders’ Meet:

Dear confreres, we are glad that we have revived the Perpetually Professed Confreres' Meet. We had the meeting on 1 June 2016. We also had a very fruitful meeting of the Leaders on 3 and 4 June 2016. It was indeed a grace filled time. It was a beautiful expression of our fraternity. I commend and thank you for the warm and serene atmosphere that was created to live these days of planning together. I would like to congratulate and thank each and every one of you for your active participation during these meetings. There was a great openness to discuss issues that challenge us and collectively take necessary steps towards transformation. This is already the first BIG leap towards change. Condolences:

We offer our deepest condolences to the Provincial and the confreres of the Province of Shillong at the demise of Fr Sylvanus Sngi Lyngdoh, aged 95. He passed away in Shillong, on 28 May 2016 after a brief illness. He was an ardent missionary, who dedicated his life to teaching, preaching, writing and healing. Some of our confreres were privileged to be his students while in Shillong. As a mark of respect, the state of Meghalaya had declared May 30, the day of his funeral, a state holiday. May his soul rest in peace!

Salesian Saints of the Month:

Blesseds Joseph Kowalski and companion martyrs: (12 June)

When Poland was occupied by Nazis, the Salesians continued on with their educational activity. This was why the dramatic arrest came about on May 23, 1941. The Gestapo captured Fr Kowalski along with eleven other Salesians working in Krakow. At first, they were taken to the prison in Montelupich in the same city; and from there, on June 26, they were taken to the concentration camp in Auschwitz. He was given number 17.350 in the ledger. Even though in prison he secretly carried on his apostolate: he heard confessions, celebrated Mass, said the Rosary, gave clandestine conferences, also about Don Bosco, strengthening his prison friends with the will to struggle for survival. He underwent suffering and humiliation. When he was discovered with a rosary, he refused to trample on it, thus hastening his martyrdom, which occurred at Auschwitz on July 4, 1942. His body was, at first, thrown into a refuse dump, then was burned in the camp's crematorium. His countrymen began to venerate his memory, maintaining that his sacrifice made vocations in Poland more fruitful. Pope John Paul II was of the same opinion, and became personally interested in the cause of various Polish martyrs. He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in Warsaw on June 13, 1999.

Saint Joseph Cafasso: (23 June)

Joseph Cafasso was born at Castelnuovo d'Asti in Piedmont, Italy, of peasant parents. He studied at the seminary in Turin, and was ordained in 1833. He continued his theological studies at the seminary and university in Turin and then, at the Institute of St Francis. Despite a deformed spine, he became a brilliant lecturer in moral theology there. He was a popular teacher, who actively opposed Jansenism, and fought state intrusion into Church affairs. He succeeded Luigi Guala as rector of the Institute in 1848 and made a deep impression on his young priest students with his holiness and insistence on discipline and high standards. He was a sought-after confessor and spiritual adviser, and ministered to prisoners, working to improve their terrible conditions. He met Don Bosco in 1827 and the two became close friends. It was through Joseph's encouragement that Bosco decided his vocation was working with boys. Joseph was his adviser, worked closely with him in his foundations, and convinced others to fund and found religious institutes and charitable organizations. Joseph Cafasso died on June 23 in Turin and was canonized in 1947.
