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Faithful Stewards: Transparent and Accountable

Dear Confreres,

On 24th May we had the perpetual profession of four of our brothers and we were also blessed with eight new Salesians. Attending these solemn celebrations and listening to the 'yes' pronounced by these young men, it struck me that this acceptance of God's will for a particular way of life was not a momentary one, but an *experiential continuum*. A 'YES', which is supposed to guide our everyday lives and choices. By answering the call of God, we through religious profession, dedicate ourselves, our whole energies and our entire life in the service of the Lord. We renew this commitment every day through our prayer of Consecration. Doing so we offer ourselves a greater possibility of discerning God's will through obedience, seeking the abundance of spiritual graces through poverty and genuinely loving all of creation in chastity. We renounce our personal will by professing obedience, our right to own personal property by professing poverty and exclusive and particular friendships by professing chastity. Our vows assist us to discern and accomplish the will of God, choose Him to be our only treasure and our only love. As Consecrated Religious, we have freely and publicly chosen to be totally available and give of ourselves totally to the Lord and His people, and particularly as Salesians, we opt for the young, especially who are poor and abandoned.

As those called by the Lord and as those who have freely opted to respond to His call, we are called to a very specific mission. For us Salesians, this mission, even though enriched by our individual charism and skill, is neither an individual effort nor a merely personal initiative. It is one entrusted to us by God, for His people. As professed religious we are called to be the light of Christ in the world. Our task is to facilitate God get in touch with His people and assist people to savour the Lord. St John Paul II reminds us to, "allow the light and the healing presence of Christ, shine brightly through your lives. In that way, all those who come into contact with you will discover the loving kindness of God." This is possible only when we are transparent, both to God and His people. By our very profession we vow to God and before all

people that we will let the light shine *through* us; that at no point in time or place are we to obstruct, appropriate only for ourselves or deviate for personal gains, this light.

Sometimes, this bright light of Christ does not glow within us and through us, because we become opaque or non-transparent. This happens especially when we let ourselves be trapped in personal attachments and achievements, by an excessive desire to possess material goods, through particular and exclusive friendships, through holding onto ideologies and clinging onto pet projects. There has been an increasing inclination, especially in the recent years, towards a more personal life (cutting us off from others - confreres, laity and youngsters), individualism, personal friendships and unnecessary possessions. We become less transparent when we have something to hide - hide from God and hide from other people. This hampers our mission and gnaws at our own consecrated vocation.

Linked very much with transparency is the virtue of accountability. In a sense it is a responsibility to let God and others see us through and through. By our profession we agree to render an honest account to God all that He blesses us with (graces, vocation, time, inspiration, energy...) and to His people that what we receive through them (trust, respect, affection, collaboration, money, property...).

We often think of accountability only in terms of finances and of material goods. This is a huge misconception. We need to become accountable, first and foremost, with our own lives, which we through profession have pledged for the salvation of the young. Once we strive to be genuinely accountable of and by our personal lives, the rest will fall in place. Let us not hesitate or fear to ask ourselves and one another as to how accountable we are to God, to each other and the young people entrusted to our care.

Don Bosco did warn us in his spiritual testament: *Be on your guard and see to it neither the love of the world, nor affection for relatives, nor the desire for a more comfortable life lead you to the great mistake of profaning your sacred vows and betraying the religious profession by which we are consecrated to the Lord. When the desire for ease and comfort grows up among us, our pious society will have run its course.*

As we continue to re-dimension and reinvigorate our mission and vision, let us be courageous to let the light of Christ shine through us. Let God and our young people see, *through* us, each other. Let us not dissipate our graces and resources in concealing our personal agendas, rather help young people discover their own God given graces and resources.

Both of them played a major role in the spread of the Salesian mission in the North-East. Through the mercy of God, may they rest in peace.

Salesian Saint of the Month

Bl. Maria Romero Meneses (Jul 7): She was one of eight children born to a wealthy, upper-class family. At the age of twelve she spent a year extremely sick from rheumatic fever; she was paralyzed for six months and her heart was permanently damaged. She was cured by the intercession and apparition of Our Lady, Help of Christians, during which she understood her vocation to be a Salesian sister. She joined the *Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians* in 1920, and on 6 January 1929 in Nicaragua, Maria made her final profession as a Salesian Sister. Transferred to San Jose, Costa Rica in 1931 she taught music, drawing and typing to rich school girls, trained catechists and trades to the poor. Many of her students were won over to her way of life, and worked with her to help the poor and abandoned.

Maria developed a ministry of fund raising and of showing the wealthy practical ways to bring their charity to the poor. She opened a school for poor girls in 1961, and in 1966 a clinic staffed by volunteer doctors. In 1973 she organized the construction of seven homes, which became the foundation of the village of Centro San Jose, a community where poor families could have decent homes. An excellent teacher, manager and fund-raiser, she was known for her way of bringing God into the personal lives of people, especially through a sincere love and devotion to the Eucharist.

Conclusion


