“Work, work, work” - Don Bosco

Dear Confreres,

A very happy feast of St. Joseph, the patron of our Province. Through his powerful intercession we have completed these 25 years of fruitful service to the poor and downtrodden. St. Joseph reminds us of our commitment and dedication to work.

Many years ago, a smart, intelligent and capable young man, was forced due to certain circumstances to work in a limestone quarry. He used to break stones and carry buckets of lime. His hands cracked and used to bleed due to the bitter cold. This man persevered in his attitude towards work and times changed. From his experiences of the value of work, he wrote:

*Work is a good thing. It corresponds to human dignity, expresses this dignity and increases it. Work is a good thing, for humanity through work not only transforms nature, but also achieves fulfillment as human beings, and indeed in a sense becomes ‘more human beings.’*

That young man working in the limestone quarry was Saint John Paul II and the quote is from his encyclical, ‘*On Human Work*’. The same can be said about our Father and Founder St. John Bosco who had to work hard right from his childhood, even to support his own education. Later in life, it was his tireless work that wore him out. No wonder, the concept of work is abounding in Salesian literature. *Work and Temperance will make our congregation flourish.* (BM XII, 338). We also know that by our work we participate in the creative action of God and we also cooperate with Christ, in building God’s kingdom (C 18). *Unremitting and self-sacrificing work is a dear characteristic left us by Don Bosco, and is a concrete expression of our poverty. In our daily labours we are at one with the poor who live by the sweat of their brow, and we bear witness to the human and Christian value of work(C 78).* Even while on his deathbed Don Bosco invited his sons to ‘*Work, Work, Work.*’

Though there are many aspects to work, I would like to dwell on just two of them, Work as Spirituality and Work as responsibility.

#### Work as Spirituality:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that *by work man participates in the Divine work of creation. When united to Christ, work is redemptive* (CCC 2427). Work creates an intrinsic relationship between the acting subject and the object of action. The work of creation is not detached from the creator. When God chose to create humanity, he transferred something of himself to the creation. We read in Genesis, that He created humanity in his own image and likeness. He breathed his breath into us. This way God sanctified work.

This spiritual dimension of work is evident in the life of St. Joseph. The task of being a foster father, of nurturing the life of Jesus and even teaching him a trade (carpentry), is a participation in the new creation that God intends to bring through Christ. St. Joseph was committed and dedicated to this noble work. God chose Don Bosco and us his sons to collaborate and work for the salvation of the young. In all our efforts and interventions on behalf of the young, we share something of ourselves. Through our relentless work, we find Christ in the young and at the same time, we bring Christ to them.

Contrary to this understanding, we could fall prey to an idea of work as something detached from oneself and therefore a burden. Let us look up to Don Bosco who gave dignity to work and made it a redemptive action. Let Don Bosco's words be ours today as we work for the young in different situations: *'for you I study, for you I work, for you I live, for you I am ready to give even my life'*.

#### Work as Responsibility:

Called upon to take Mary as his wife and entrusted with the task of taking care of Jesus, St. Joseph took this great responsibility to his heart. He provided for and nurtured Jesus as his own.

Through our consecration, we are entrusted with the care of the young. We have been given the task of becoming foster fathers to them after the example of Don Bosco. We have been entrusted with the responsibility of nurturing their lives. The danger that we could face

sometimes, is that we don't own up our work, our apostolate and our young. We could become mere disconnected service providers rather than responsible care-takers. In each of our institutions, we need to take full responsibility for the growth and well-being of children and youth entrusted to our care. We accomplish this responsibility in a silent and humble manner as St. Joseph did. Let us as members of this glorious province of St. Joseph, try to imitate our heavenly patron.
