Vocational Fragility

"My worry is not that we are losing the ability to make up our own minds, but that it's becoming too easy to do so" - David Dunning

Dear Confreres,

On 1 February I have completed one year of service in office. It has been a great journey of faith with rich experiences and challenges as well. We have a great province that is committed to the cause of the poorest of the poor. One of the challenges that we face in our Province is the existence of small communities. Is it because we have expanded too fast as a Province? I think it is not the question of expansion of the communities, but rather that of reduction of the number of confreres. We have lost nearly eighty confreres in the past decade.

Looking back, seemingly 'rock-solid' vocations have fallen apart. I think our vocation in the post-modern era is inescapably fragile. Statistics clearly show that, this oft used term *Vocational Fragility* is not an alarming misnomer, but a disquieting reality. In the past sessenium Salesian India has lost around 520 Salesians, which is almost 25% of the whole of Salesian India. This phenomenon is noticed not only among Salesians but in many of the major congregations of both men and women. This calls for a reflection and a remedy.

The Individual, has never ever been as frail and vulnerable as in the past decade. Religious Vocations are born from this frail and vulnerable humanity. We have been witnesses of this fragility, time and again, in our own personal lives and in the lives of our confreres. We often succumb to personal weaknesses and inconsistencies. A perpetual commitment seems to be an archaic practice. In the secular world today

many youngsters shy away from permanent commitments like marriage and family life. We see the same phenomenon reflected in the consecrated life as well.

The world runs after ephemeral experiences, fleeting pleasures and superficial relationships rather than deeper and lasting experiences with oneself and with others. Fragility in our vocation stems from a shallow faith and a superficial relationship with God. Christ does not become the *raison d'etre* of our lives. It is only a deep faith that can sustain us in the different fragile moments of our Salesian life. Fragility is not conquered once and for all. It is a continuous challenge to which faith is the answer. Often we tend to compromise our personal and community moments of prayer which are supposed to provide daily nourishment to our Salesain vocation.

Our society makes of the individual the absolute and unapologetic author of truth and norm. We consider it as our inalienable right to chose for ourselves our pattern of life, our convictions, which most often are conditioned by our likes and dislikes. Breaking a false sense of this autonomy and self sufficiency, we need to recognize the importance of a spiritual guide/director. Even the best doctor in the world does not do a self diagnosis. Regular and consistent spiritual direction is like a shield against fragility. All of us need to have a spiritual director who accompanies us through our vocational journey.
